COMPUTER TRAINING

This educational program provides the community with open computer access, and provides individuals with general computer skills through classroom and individual instruction. Specific attention is directed toward Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Access applications. Lab is open from 10:00 am- 6:00 pm. Hours vary for each class.

Eligibility and fees: There are no restrictions in program eligibility and no previous computer experience is required. Fees are dependent upon the course taken and scholarships are available to eligible students.

HEALTH SERVICES

Free Clinic of Our Towns

A medical program that provides primary care to uninsured and under-insured individuals residing in North Mecklenburg and South Iredell counties. Services provided include health assessments, physician services, diagnosis and treatment for illnesses, health education, nutritional educations, referral support, and flu vaccinations. No obstetrician services are available. The clinic is offered every Thursday evening from 6:00 PM – 8:30 PM.

Eligibility and fees: Must live in the North Mecklenburg or South Iredell. Patients are seen first come, first served basis and there is no fee for this service.

Free Dental Project

A program that provides free dental care to low-income families without dental insurance in the community. Services provided include dental examinations, treatment, dental charting, and instruction on proper dental hygiene. The program is offered the second and fourth Wednesday of each month from 6:00 pm – 8:30 pm at the Huntersville First Baptist Church.

Eligibility and fees: To be eligible, patients must be residents of North Mecklenburg or South Iredell counties and have no dental insurance or Medicaid. Patients must first be seen by a dental screening at 6:15 PM on the second or fourth Wednesday before an appointment can be scheduled for a later date.

Parish Nurse Services

A program through which a registered nurse promotes wellness, provides health education and counseling, advocates for clients, connects individuals with appropriate community resources, and integrates the faith–health relationship. This service is available by appointment Monday through Friday from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. Other times may be available as needed.

Eligibility and fees: Available to residents of North Mecklenburg and South Iredell counties. No fee, except for some screenings and flu vaccinations.

LATINO SUPPORT SERVICES

This program provides translation and general support to the Latino community. Services include translation, interpretation, counseling, problem solving, and advocacy. A brief assessment of the client’s situation is required to receive assistance. The program is available Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM.

Eligibility and fees: Available to residents of North Mecklenburg and South Iredell counties. No fee for this service.

LIFE COMPASS PROGRAM

This program provides a social worker to assist individuals in achieving the highest level of self-sufficiency possible. Referrals and case management services are available in the areas of education, health, housing, transportation, and employment. Limited financial assistance is available. The program is available by appointment weekdays from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM with evening appointments available as needed.

Eligibility and fees: Available to residents of North Mecklenburg and South Iredell counties. An assessment of the client’s situation by the social worker is required.

LOAVES AND FISHES

This program provides one week’s worth of groceries for families in the surrounding area. The food pantry is open on Wednesdays from 12:30 PM – 3:30 PM, and on Fridays from 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM. Call for Monday hours.

Eligibility and fees: Community members can obtain a referral at the center or be referred by other agencies. Families can only receive groceries once every 60 days.

LYDIA'S LOFT

This off-site program provides clothing to low-income families in the Lake Norman area. Families must obtain a referral at the Ada Jenkins Center, at which time directions will be given to the location in Huntersville.

Eligibility and fees: Available to residents of North Mecklenburg and South Iredell counties. Families not meeting certain income restrictions will need to meet with a social worker. Families can visit the clothing loft once every 60 days.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING

APPCNC provides conferences, training programs and speakers on effective prevention strategies; sexuality education; role of church; evaluation of programs; teen fathers; adolescent health centers; abstinence education; media.

Eligibility: Statewide; 100 counties; adults; professionals and community volunteers involved in adolescent pregnancy prevention; no fees, except for some conferences and seminars

RESEARCH AND RESOURCES

APPCNC conducts and disseminates research to support prevention programs; video and curricula lending library available to all; publishes prevention resources such as posters, parent education brochures; resource library and materials center on all issues related to teen pregnancy.

Eligibility: Statewide; 100 counties; adults; professionals and community volunteers involved in prevention; small fee for some publications

LOCAL COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT

To assist each county to create and support council / task force that serves as the advocate, educator, catalyst, and promoter of prevention programs and strategies in the community, APPCNC provides workshops manuals, resources, teen assistance.

Eligibility: Statewide; 100 counties; adults; professionals and volunteers involved in adolescent pregnancy, no fees except for some printed manuals

ADVOCACY AND AWARENESS

Awareness and advocacy activities statewide to facilitate prevention of adolescent pregnancy such as Let's Talk Month, Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month; securing funds, grants, and legislation for prevention projects; newsletter "The Advocate."

Eligibility: Statewide: 100 counties; adults; professionals and community volunteers involved in adolescent pregnancy prevention

NAMI is a self-help, advocacy, education and support organization providing services for families, friends, mental health and other related professionals, and the mental health consumers of Iredell County diagnosed with severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI) or neurobiological brain disorders (NBD). These conditions are individually known as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, panic disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, clinical depression, etc. For children and adolescents, serious mental illnesses include the same conditions experienced by adults as well as attention deficit disorder, autism, pervasive developmental disorder, and Tourette's syndrome. These conditions are physical and genetic in origin, resulting in disturbances in thinking, feeling, relating, and a decrease in the person's ability to cope with the ordinary demands of life.

NAMI Iredell is an affiliate of NAMI North Carolina and the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill (NAMI). NAMI Iredell offers:

- Support in dealing with the stressors of coping with chronic mental illness;
- Education for members, the community, and decision-makers (such as police, fire, medical, and rescue response about severe mental illness;
- Advocacy on the local, state, and national levels for community-based services for persons with brain disorders; and
- Working with NAMI and North Carolina to end discrimination against individuals with chronic mental illnesses in education, insurance plans, housing, access to services and employment.

PROGRAMS

Provides public education; work-site wellness programs; free patient service programs; free wigs, hats, and breast prostheses; research and community development grants; college scholarships for cancer survivors; volunteer opportunities for the public.

REACH TO RECOVERY

Trained volunteer breast cancer survivors provide support and information to others experiencing or concerned about breast cancer regardless of treatment or surgery; visit may be requested by patient, family member, or healthcare provider.

LOOK GOOD ... FEEL BETTER

Licensed cosmetologists teach female cancer patients techniques to address cosmetic side effects of treatment; sessions are held the 4th Monday of each month from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Women's Breast Health Center in Statesville.

I CAN COPE

An educational program about living with cancer that offers classes about cancer and its treatments led by healthcare providers, social workers, etc.

FRESHSTART

ACS quit smoking program consisting of 4 one-hour sessions designed to empower a smoker to stop smoking in two weeks.

SUPPORT AND INFORMATION

ARMED FORCES EMERGENCY SERVICES

Around the world communications network linking armed forces personnel to their families during personal emergencies.

Eligibility: Iredell County citizens in active service, reservists on active duty, civilians with Defense Department and their families

BLOOD SERVICES

On average, 10--15 blood donation opportunities available locally every month, including 1-2 VIP drives where donors make an appointment to donate at the Red Cross office, and the entire process takes one hour. Donor's temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hematocrit are checked prior to donation.

Eligibility: Weigh at least 110 pounds; good health; must be at least 17 years old

DISASTER SERVICES

Response to any manmade or natural disaster that displaces individuals from their homes. Assistance includes basic necessities such as temporary lodging, clothing, food, emergency medical prescriptions, glasses, and first month's rent. Emergency shelters provided for large-scale disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, chemical spills, winter storms, etc. Assistance also provided in the form of canteen to emergency workers for extended operations. All disaster assistance is provided free of charge.

Eligibility: Victims of disaster (from single family fires to major disasters such as hurricanes). All disaster assistance is provided free of charge.

HEALTH AND SAFETY SERVICES

Courses available in adult CPR, infant, and child CPR, basic first aid, basic aid training and baby sitting. Teaches skills needed to respond in respiratory and cardiac emergencies including airway obstruction, rescue breathing and CPR. Courses also available in the use of AED (automated external defibrillation) and PDT (preventing disease transmission). All courses developed in cooperation with National Research Council, National Academy of Science and OSHA approved. Workplace courses available at the company location. Some courses are available in Spanish.

Eligibility: Dependent upon course; basic courses open to all; higher level and instructor courses have prerequisites, fees vary depending on course.

ARMED FORCES EMERGENCY SERVICES

Around the world communications network linking armed forces personnel to their families during personal emergencies.

Eligibility: Iredell County and North Mecklenburg men and women in active service; reservists on active duty; civilians with Defense Department and their families.

BLOOD SERVICES

On average, 10-15 blood donation opportunities available locally every month, including VIP drives where donors make an appointment to donate at a Red Cross office; the entire process is about an hour. Bloodmobile drives are scheduled to meet patient needs in region. Drives are held in community buildings, industries, and churches. New sponsors are always needed. Call office for dates, times, and sponsorship of visits.

Eligibility: Donor - must be 17 years-of-age (minimum), weigh at least 110 lbs., and be in good health

DISASTER SERVICES

Preparedness program: recruitment and training of volunteers to assist in disasters. Assistance may be in the form of emergency mass care and/or assistance to individuals with verified disaster-caused needs. Help is given on basis of uniform guidelines and includes use of available community resources. We also teach disaster preparation courses to groups.

Eligibility: Victims of disaster (from single family fires to major disasters such as hurricanes). All disaster assistance is provided free of charge.

HEALTH AND SAFETY SERVICES

Health and safety courses developed in cooperation with National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences courses; adult CPR, infant and child CPR, AED, first aid; water safety, AIDS education, and bloodborne pathogens. Workplace courses are available at company location with a minimum of 8 participants. Some courses are available in Spanish. Youth programs include basic aid training, which is a first aid course designed for children age 9 and above, as well as babysitting which is designed for children age 11 and above.

Eligibility: Dependent upon course; basic courses open to all; higher level and instructor courses have prerequisites. Fees vary from no cost to \$56.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The Lake Norman office provides transportation to medical appointments for people who have no other means of transportation. The appointment can be anywhere from Statesville to Charlotte.

Eligibility: Must live in South Iredell or North Mecklenburg, have no other means of getting to the medical appointment, and be able to walk (vehicles are not handicap accessible).

SENTENCING SERVICES (SS)

APO works with pre-trial clients to develop a comprehensive, community-based sentencing plan to present to the court, based on person's risks and needs. Input into the plan can be received from crime victims, family members, arresting officers, probation officers, community service, and others. Referrals can be self, attorney, district attorney, probation, or judge.

Eligibility: Set by NC General Statutes; residents of Alexander, Davidson, Davie, & Iredell Counties, 16 and older

IREDELL COUNTY RESOURCE CENTER (ICRC)

Funded by Criminal Justice Partnership Program funds through the North Carolina Division of Community Corrections. The program offers outpatient substance abuse treatment, life skills (men, women, youth), behavioral intervention, employability, educational support, individual counseling, and drug screening. Clients are referred to other services such as domestic violence, anger management, sex offender management, and parenting classes as deemed necessary.

Eligibility: Referrals by Judge, Probation, or TASC; 16 years & older

RE-ENTRY SERVICES

Provides a single point of re-entry for ex-offenders for direct services and referrals to services, case management, and mentoring.

Eligibility: Ex-offenders in Iredell County and surrounding area; referrals from self, family Department of Corrections, local detention center, probation, community agencies, and faith-based groups

YOUTH INCENTIVE PROGRAM (YIP)

Competency-based life skills curriculum targets youth at risk of exiting the education system without completion, and who are in need of guidance and training to achieve a law-abiding, productive, and healthy life. The program stresses respect for self and others and teamwork. YIP addresses family life, peer pressure, education, career opportunities, substance abuse education, and gang awareness issues.

Eligibility: 12-19 years of age; referrals from parents, schools, law enforcement, court personnel, and other community agencies.

PARENT ADVOCACY

Staff recreation therapist available to consult with local parks and recreation departments. Weeklong summer camp sessions, with separate weeks by age and functioning level. Staffing ratios 1: 1 or 1: 2. Swimming, lake, games, crafts, music, and other activities. Registration fills quickly.

Eligibility: NC residents with autism ages 4 and up; sliding fee scale

TREATMENT SERVICES

Residential Group Care is provided for youth in need of out-of-home care for which less restrictive alternatives are not available. Couples, called Family – Teachers, are well trained and committed to demonstrating healthy family behaviors and teaching important social skills. Youth are prepared for permanence with the child's natural family or relative, adoption, long-term foster care, independent living, or a step down into a less restrictive environment.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages 8-17. For referral, contact the Coordinator of Admissions, 704-873-1011.

Foster Care is provided for children who must live outside their own homes for a variety of reasons. Some children need short-term foster care during a family crisis, while others need care because of abuse or neglect. There are also children who need additional structure and development due to behavior or mental health concerns. The foster care program provides excellent training and ongoing support to foster parents and children.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages infant to 21. For referral, contact the Coordinator of Admissions, 704-873-1011.

Alternative Education / Day Treatment environments are provided for preschool, elementary, middle and high school youth on campus and off campus. These programs offer alternative educational environments that focus on behavioral and educational needs. In many cases, these students need a therapeutic environment where they receive individualized classroom attention, hands-on learning opportunities, and behavioral interventions. Our goal is to strengthen social skills and foundational academic skills so students can rejoin their peers in the appropriate public school setting.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages 3-18. For referral, contact the Coordinator of Admissions, 704-873-1011.

Community Support Services provide assistance to children and families that have been assessed with a mental health diagnosis. Professionals work one-on-one with individual children in home and community-based settings to build skills which will allow them to manage their mental health issues effectively. Crisis response 24/7.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages 3-17. For referral, contact the Coordinator of Admissions, 704-873-1011.

Preschool Day Treatment Classroom is a 12- month mental health classroom at Springs of Faith serving six children, ages 3-5, with mental health I or II diagnosis such as oppositional disorders, bipolar disorder, separation anxiety disorder, compulsive behaviors, or depressive disorders.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages 3-5 with a mental health I or II diagnosis. To begin referral process, call 704-924-7140.

Full Day Childcare provides early childhood education to children on the main campus at Barium Springs. Fees for this program are based on a sliding fee scale. Priority is given to families needing assistance from DSS and those with special needs. Licensed by the state and accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children.

Eligibility: Boys and girls ages 6 weeks to 5 years. To register, contact L.C. Wagner Family and Child Development Center, 704-872-7351.

More at Four Programs are offered on and off campus. This free program is designed to help at-risk four year olds prepare for kindergarten. Both centers are licensed and accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children.

Eligibility: Boys and girls who turn four on or before October 16. Children must meet eligibility criteria for income or other risk factors. For more information or to enroll a child, contact us at 704-872-7351.

Early Childhood Education and Consultation is provided to childcare centers, providers, and agencies to improve the quality of early childcare and education throughout the state.

MARITAL COUNSELING

Pre and post marital counseling to persons considering or having already established a partner relationship addressing issues of communication, roles, decision making, sharing interests and activities, sexual relations, financial issues, etc. Individual, couple, and group therapies utilized.

Eligibility: Persons who live or work in Iredell County. Income based sliding scale fees.

FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

Supportive counseling to individuals and families in coping more effectively with problems related to family functioning resulting from marital discord, divorce, blended families, single parenting, changes in roles of family members, etc. Individual and family therapy utilized.

Services include:

- **Child/Family Services:** Assessment and treatment of children ages 6 to 12 who are behaviorally or emotionally troubled, who may do poorly in school, withdraw from relations with others, present violent aggressive, or oppositional and defiant behavior.
- **Adolescent/Family Services:** Assessment and treatment of adolescents ages 12 through 17 experiencing significant difficulties with the trials of the “teen years”. The Alternative Treatment Options program focuses on teens who are at risk for or have come into conflict with the law, aiming to redirect their behavior so that sentencing to a state training school will not be required.
- **Adult/Family Services:** Assessment and treatment of adults experiencing anxiety, and depression related to poor relations with others within the family, including physical, sexual, and domestic abuse and violence. Also addressed are problems at work, or difficulties adjusting to loss, grief, bereavement, suicide, and other phase of life changes.

Eligibility: Persons who live or work in Iredell County. Income based sliding scale.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES

Assessment, intervention, and treatment, and referral services are provided to all ages of persons and their families experiencing the harmful effects of alcohol or other drugs. 12 Step programming is provided utilizing both morning and evening options to minimize conflict with work schedules. Co-dependency issues are addressed with family members in family and group settings. Referrals to self-help support groups such as AA, NA, AlAnon, and Alateen, are strongly encouraged.

Eligibility: Persons who live or work in Iredell County. Income based sliding scale fees.

DWI ASSESSMENTS

DWI assessments are provided with assessment prescribed services offered or referral to other community facilities. Fees are related to the number of hours required by the assessment. Networking with the judicial system and other substance abuse providers assures efficient utilizations of resources. Aftercare counseling is offered following detox or residential treatment. Both morning and evening options minimize conflict with work schedules, utilizing individual, family, and group therapies.

Eligibility: Judicial system referrals. State established fee of \$100.00 for assessments.

EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Assistance in policy development, supervisory training, and clinical services are provided to companies and other organizations concerned about the impact of troubled employees on the company's productivity and safety records. Clinical services to employees and their immediate family members are provided or employees are referred to the most appropriate service provider. Crisis consultation is available on the work site to assist the company in the proper handling of troubled employee situations. Dove House is a non-profit organization that provides a safe and child-friendly facility from which a multi-disciplinary team works to support the investigation, intervention and successful prosecution of reported child sexual abuse cases in Iredell and Alexander Counties of North Carolina. This eliminates the need for a child victim to be taken to multiple “scary” locations (such as emergency rooms and police stations) for forensic interviews and medical examinations.

The **multi-disciplinary team** includes six law enforcement agencies, the District Attorney’s office, departments of social services, Guardian Ad Litem programs, medical and mental health personnel and Dove House staff.

Dove House also conducts neutral, fact-finding **interviews of child victims** by a trained forensic interviewer to determine if sexual abuse has occurred. This approach produces evidence that will stand up in court if an investigation leads to criminal prosecution.

Dove House **victim advocates** assist the children and families throughout the investigation and prosecution process providing emotional support and assistance with counseling and other referrals.

Dove House has a fully equipped **medical exam** room staffed by volunteer pediatricians and SANE nurses all certified in conducting pediatric sexual assault exams. The room includes state-of-the-art technology for efficient and effective collection of forensic evidence.

The overriding goal of the Dove House is to protect child victims from further harm while minimizing trauma during the investigation and intervention processes. In addition, Dove House seeks to protect society from the offenders and to hold offenders accountable for their actions.

If you suspect a child has been sexually assaulted, contact law enforcement, and they will begin the Dove House process.

HOSPICE & PALLIATIVE CARE

Provides quality care and a plan for living by helping patients and families meet their end-of-life goals. Medicare certified NC license, ACHC accredited. Services include nursing, certified nursing assistants, medical social work, spiritual and grief counseling, community-based volunteers, bereavement care, end-of-life care programs, medical equipment and supplies, and medication. Nursing services through “on-call” are available 24 hour/day, 7 days/week.

Eligibility: Any patient with a life-limiting illness (prognosis generally six months or less) not seeking cure, as approved by attending physician. Bereavement care and end of life care programs are open to the entire community at no cost.

GORDON HOSPICE HOUSE

A state-of-the-art nine bed facility for patients who want to live their remaining days in a home like environment, pain free with a sense of dignity, peace and comfort. Includes six residential rooms and three inpatient (acute) care rooms, plus shared dining room, family room, meditation room and kitchen. Specially trained staff including nurses, nursing assistants and the Hospice medical director offers an alternative to a hospital stay for those in their final weeks of life.

Eligibility: Any patients with life-limiting illness whose condition, symptoms, home environment or caregiver situation prevents them from remaining at home during their final days or weeks of life. The Gordon Hospice House is open to the entire community, with first preference given to Iredell County residents, and then members of the surrounding community.

RAINBOW KIDZ

A focused program for children ages birth to 18 that enhances the quality of life and relieves the suffering for the child and family members.

Palliative Services focus on the physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of the child and family. Care is focused on reducing pain and other distressing symptoms and is often provided at the same time as life-prolonging care. Health professionals include doctors, nurses, certified nursing assistants; medical social workers; counselors; chaplains and community-based volunteers. Services also provide post death grieving support for children and teens through individual, group, and school meetings.

Eligibility: Any family with an infant or child birth-18 years, living with life-threatening or life limiting illness or condition. The Pediatric Palliative Care program is open to the entire community at no cost.

WORK FIRST EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Provides emergency assistance to persons who are in need of help that would benefit a child. Types of assistance include shelter, utilities, rent/eviction; payment made to vendor.

Eligibility: Must be Iredell County resident; have at least one child 17 or younger in the home; be in a crisis situation; meet income, reserve, and citizenship requirements.

WORK FIRST FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Assesses educational and employment readiness needs. Assists with education planning, attainment, job training, job seeking, job retraining behaviors, and removing barriers to employment. Job retention services are also provided. Financial assistance provided to help eligible families meet living expenses or employment needs.

Eligibility: Depends on residency, citizenship, age, kinship, living with, income and reserves.

150% OF SERVICES

Employment services for families who are not on WFFA. Services include employment-related transportation and work-related expenses.

Eligibility: Must be Iredell County resident and have child 17 or younger in the home who meets kinship and citizenship rules; income below 150% of poverty.

WHEELS-TO-WORK

This is a program to provide car ownership to help meet employment-related transportation needs.

Eligibility: Must have valid NC driver's license; income must be below 150% of poverty; must have child 17 or younger who meets kinship and citizenship/alien rules in the home.

FOOD STAMPS AND NUTRITIONAL SERVICES PROGRAM

Provides eligible households with food stamps one time per month in order to purchase food for the family unit and raise its nutritional level.

Eligibility: Must be U.S. citizen, resident of Iredell County, and meet income, resources, and other regulations mandated by USDA

INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY ADJUSTMENT COUNSELING SERVICES

Assists in negotiating community resources; personal and family counseling on relationships: interpersonal, marital, family, and community.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident.

ADOPTION

Accepts and prepares infants and children for placement; evaluates families; prepares studies; seeks appropriate children for placement; coordinates and supervises placements.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident, birth-18 years; 21 and older for adoptive parents.

CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM (IV-D)

Child support services are categorized into five major areas: Location of absent parents; Establishment of paternity for illegitimate children; Establishment of legal child support obligations; Collection of child support payments; Enforcement of child support obligations.

Eligibility: Services provided to any custodial parent regardless of income level; recipients receiving AFDC automatically referred to child support, birth to age 18; if child is emancipated, child support order cannot be established; \$10 application fee for custodial parent not receiving public assistance.

CHILD FOSTER CARE

Evaluates families; assists in licensing process; makes and supervises placements; monitors licensing standards and assists in relicensing; determines child's need for care; locates and arranges placement; supervises placement and services to meet child's needs.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident, birth - 21; foster parents 21-65.

CHILD DAY CARE

Assesses need and eligibility; helps arrange placement; pays for care at approved facility.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; must be income-eligible; child: birth and up; vendor: 18 and up; sliding fee scale.

CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Receives referrals, assesses information in relation to law; investigates or assesses allegations and determines if child is abused, neglected, or dependent; if substantiated, or found in need of service, provides services to reduce risk to child and ameliorate abusive/neglectful conditions.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident in need of protective services; birth to 18 years.

ADULT DAY CARE SERVICE

Assesses need and eligibility; arranges placement and transportation; pays for care at licensed facility.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident, must be income eligible; 18 and up; sliding fee scale.

ADULT CARE HOMES

Assists operator in licensing procedures for rest homes; supervises facilities' adherence to rest home standards; assists families in locating nursing or rest home; assists new residents' adjustment to nursing or rest home; provides financial assistance for nursing or rest home care.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; must be financially eligible for nursing/rest home care

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Receives referrals and assesses need for protective services; assists in alleviating conditions causing need for protection.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident who is disabled, abused, neglected, or exploited and is in need of agency intervention; 18 years and up.

HEALTH SUPPORT

Facilitates access to and use of needed medical care.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident

PROBLEM PREGNANCY SERVICES

Assists in exploring alternatives: abortion, adoption, keeping baby. Maternity home placement; prenatal care; locating community resources to support decision.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident.

MEDICAID

A medical assistance program for low-income people; services include hospital care, lab and x-ray services, hospice and hospital care, prescription drugs, physician visits, skilled/intermediate nursing home care, eyeglasses, dental services, and personal care services in the home; special programs include Medicaid for the aged, family and children. In Mooresville, Medicaid applications are taken at the South Iredell Government Center three days a week (704-663-1481).

Eligibility: Differs for various Medicaid programs; individuals must meet income guidelines.

MEDICAID FOR THE BLIND (MAB)

Medicaid for the Blind is a medical assistance program for low-income blind people. Covered services can include hospital care, laboratory and x-ray services, hospice and home health care, prescription drugs, physician visits, skilled and intermediate nursing home care, eyeglasses, dental services, and personal care services in the home.

Eligibility: Iredell County residents; must be legally blind according to SSI definition; must meet income/asset guidelines set by state and federal governments.

MEDICAID FOR THE DISABLED (MAD)

Medicaid is a medical assistance program for low-income people. Covered services can include hospital care, laboratory and x-ray services, hospice and home health care, prescription drugs, physician visits, skilled and intermediate nursing home care, eyeglasses, dental services, and personal care services in the home.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident, must be determined disabled by Social Security standards and meet federal and state income and asset guidelines; under age 65.

MEDICARE-AID (MBQ)

Medicare-Aid covers Medicare co-payments for Medicare-eligible individuals and pays the Medicare premiums. This program pays only for services covered by Medicare.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; must meet income and asset guidelines based on state and federal regulations; must be receiving Medicare benefits.

MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION

Assists in arranging for and paying for transportation to medical provider.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; Medicaid eligible and certified.

NORTH CAROLINA HEALTH CHOICE FOR CHILDREN

NCHC provides free or low cost health insurance through Blue Cross /Blue Shield of NC to eligible uninsured children. It provides checkups, immunizations, specialists, hospital care, surgery, dental care, counseling, sick visits, hearing and vision care, lab tests, medicines, and therapies.

Eligibility: Child under 19, NC resident, not insured presently (two month waiting period), and meet income guidelines.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS (SAD; SAA)

Special Assistance for the Disabled (SAD) and Special Assistance for the Aged (SAA) provide financial assistance for eligible persons in licensed facilities. Medicaid services are also provided.

Eligibility: Must meet income and asset guidelines; be a resident of domiciliary care facility or mental health group facility; SSI eligible or ineligible; Special Assistance for the Disabled: 18-64; Special Assistance for the Aged: 65 and over.

CERTAIN DISABLED (SCD)

A financial assistance program for eligible individuals. There is no medical assistance with this program.

Eligibility: Iredell County residents; must have been denied disability based on Social Security standards, but must meet disability definition for this group; must meet income and asset guidelines; ages 18-64.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE – IN HOME

Special Assistance in Home is a program that specializes in financial assistance to adults to function within their community to prevent the possibility of being placed in an assisted living facility.

Eligibility: Must be Medicaid-eligible, meet poverty-level income, and be at-risk client with rest home level of care stated on FL-2 form.

ENHANCED CARE

Enhanced care provides services to Special Assistance Medicaid recipients who require extensive to total assistance with the activities of daily living (ADL) of toileting, ambulation/locomotion, and/or feeding. Enhanced care provides additional payments to the facility for these services.

Eligibility: Must receive SA Medicaid and live in assisted living facility.

COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM FOR DISABLED ADULTS (CAP/DA)

The primary goal of this program is to maintain the health, safety, and well-being of individuals who wish to remain in their own residence. Services include: in-home aide care, skilled nursing visits, incontinence supplies, nutritional supplements, wheelchair ramps, medical equipment, telephone alert, and case management support.

Eligibility: Medicaid eligible, 18 or older, at-risk of being placed in a nursing facility or currently residing in facility and wanting to return home.

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. Under the Food Stamp Act and USDA policy, discrimination is prohibited also on the basis of religion or political beliefs.

To file a complaint of discrimination, contact USDA or HHS. ADULT HEALTH

Provides health screening services, breast exams, and pap smears for adult females.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; 18 years and older; sliding fee scale

BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM (BCCCP)

Provides pap smears, breast exams and screening mammograms, assists women with abnormal breast examinations/mammograms, or abnormal cervical screenings to obtain additional diagnostic examinations.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; determined by income; target group is women 50 to 64 years of age.

CHILD HEALTH

Well child exams conducted by nurses trained in pediatric health; exam includes medical, social, developmental, nutritional history, lab work and physical exam.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident; birth to 20 years; sliding fee scale; insurance; Medicaid.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL

Deals with the investigation and follow-up of all reportable communicable diseases in Iredell County. This includes treating communicable disease contacts with preventive medications as needed.

CSC OR CHILD SERVICES COORDINATION

Case management assists families in identification of and access to services for children with special needs that will allow them the maximum opportunity to reach their development potential.

Eligibility: Iredell County children who have any risk criteria or an identified developmental delay, disability, chronic illness; birth to 5 years of age

DENTAL CLINIC

The Iredell County Health Department Dental Clinic provides dental services to children living in Iredell County. The clinic accepts Medicaid, North Carolina Health Choice, some private dental insurances and private pay based on a sliding fee scale. The Dental Clinic offers limited restorative procedures and preventive services by appointment only.

DENTAL HEALTH EDUCATION

Dental health education is offered for second and fourth grades in the Iredell/Statesville Schools and Mooresville Graded School District. This classroom education includes a variety of topics to help children obtain better oral health. Topics covered in the classroom include the discussion of regular dental visits, using sealants and fluorides, improving or changing diets, and improving oral hygiene skills. Dental Health Education in the classroom provides toothbrushes to second graders and floss to fourth graders. Education can also be offered to day cares and community groups upon request.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Uses the tools of education and enforcement to protect and preserve the health and environment of the citizens of Iredell County through the enforcement of state rules and regulations. Environmental health specialists work personally with developers, food service, realtors, homebuilders, and other agencies and individuals with specific environmental concerns or needs.

Eligibility: Resident of Iredell County or property owners in Iredell county; fees are imposed for the issuance of septic system permits, some food service plan reviews, pool permits, tattoo permits, private drinking water permits (effective 7-1-08), and existing well water sampling.

GENERAL SERVICES

Provides pregnancy tests; TB skin tests; blood tests for work; immunizations.

Eligibility: Resident of Iredell County; fees vary

IMMUNIZATIONS

Provides vaccines to any infant, child or adult needing immunizations required by North Carolina Immunization Law

Eligibility: NC resident; state supplied vaccine is free; Medicaid, some insurance and flat fee for other vaccines.

FAMILY PLANNING

Clinic designed to assist women in planning their childbearing schedule; detailed history, lab work, physical exam, counseling and education given by physician extender, nurses and educator; contraceptive supplies.

Eligibility: Women of childbearing age; sliding fee scale; Medicaid; insurance.

MATERNAL CARE COORDINATION (MCC)

Provides formal case management services to eligible women during and after pregnancy and provides intervention as early in pregnancy as possible to promote a healthy pregnancy and positive birth outcomes.

Eligibility: Pregnant Iredell County residents who are Medicaid- or potentially Medicaid-eligible

PRENATAL CLINIC

Prenatal care for eligible pregnant women.

Eligibility: Determined by household income and number in household; Iredell County residents of childbearing age; sliding fee scale; insurance; Medicaid

WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN NUTRITION PROGRAM (WIC)

Supplemental nutrition and education program to provide specific nutritional foods and education services to improve health status of target groups.

Eligibility: WIC is available to pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, infants, and children up to age 5 who meet the following criteria: (1) Be a resident of Iredell County; aliens are eligible to apply as long as they reside in the county; (2) Be at medical and/or nutritional risk; (3) Have a family income less than 185% of the US poverty income guidelines; a person receiving Medicaid, AFDC, or food stamps automatically meets the income eligibility requirement

MIGRANT & REFUGEE HEALTH

Assists refugees in locating medical care and reviews their records to assure that the patient is free of communicable disease and appropriately immunized. Assists migrants in locating sources of health care.

Eligibility: Migrants or refugees living in Iredell County

SICKLE CELL PROGRAM

Provides free sickle cell testing; free counseling for anyone identified with sickle cell disease or trait; regional counselor for genetic and further testing resources.

Eligibility: Iredell County resident diagnosed with sickle cell disease or trait, or a family member of a patient

SIDS

Counseling for families who have experienced a SIDS death; education for lay and professional groups.

Eligibility: Iredell County families who have experienced a SIDS death

STD/HIV

Testing and diagnosis of variety of sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV testing and counseling. Treatment provided when appropriate. Referral to outside resources when appropriate.

Eligibility: Medicaid or no fees

TUBERCULOSIS

Program provides follow-up and treatment of TB cases and their contacts; not for immigration purposes.

Eligibility: Medicaid or no fees

HEALTH EDUCATION AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Health Education:

Promotes and supports healthy lifestyles by providing a wide range of educational activities and programs in order to prevent disease and disability. Program conducts health fairs, health topic seminars, vasectomy referral program, Postponing Sexual Involvement (PSI) classes, puberty education, annual child fatality program, STD education classes and volunteer program.

Eligibility: Resident of Iredell County; fees vary by service provided

Healthy Carolinians:

Organizes residents to work together, emphasizing preventing health practices to improve the quality of life and health status of all individuals.

Health Promotion:

Provides nutrition education; promotes physical activity and tobacco education/prevention that supports environmental and policy changes in the community.

Emergency Preparedness:

Provides educational and outreach information on how to prepare for biological and natural disasters.

Emergency Preparedness keeps the public informed on current health related issues such as pandemic flu, influenza outbreaks and other communicable diseases.

The mission of the Iredell County Partnership for Young Children (Smart Start) is to help children enter school healthy and ready to succeed. The partnership serves families with children 0-5 years old and child care providers. Services to families include child care information and referrals and parent education programs.

Child care providers receive technical assistance, resources, training and professional development, education awards, and comprehensive benefits. The Partnership advocates for young children through community collaboration and education. Services and programs are available at ICPYC offices in Statesville and Mooresville. Latino parent educators provide assistance to Spanish speakers.

FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

- **Parents As Teachers** – is an early education program to help parents become their child’s first, best teacher and prepare children for school. Certified parent educators make monthly home visits to help parents give their child ages 0-3 years the best possible start in life. Parents participate in group meetings and children receive annual developmental screenings. The program is free and available to Iredell County parents who seek information and confidence in parenting. It is offered in English and Spanish.

- **Play To Learn** – helps children learn through play, providing weekly, one-hour groups for children and parents in Smart Start playrooms. Play groups build social, physical, emotional and intellectual skills that help prepare children for school. Activities and information target all aspects of child development. An annual enrollment fee of \$20 is charged for Iredell County residents and \$40 for out-of-county residents. Play groups are available in Statesville and Mooresville.

- **Triple P Parenting** helps parents with children 2-5 years old who regularly misbehave by fighting, throwing tantrums, whining or interrupting, who are not getting mental health services, who do not have a developmental or health concern related to the behavior, and are residents of Iredell County. Referrals are accepted from families, child care providers, community agencies and preschools.

- **1st Moms Club** is available for first-time mothers with children under 6 months old. Mothers meet monthly with a parent educator to discuss relevant topics, answer questions and hear speakers.

- **Chat & Chew** is a one-hour seminar series for parents with children 2-5 years old dealing with positive parenting tips, discipline strategies, behavior, and other developmental issues. Sessions are free but registration is required for free child care.

CHILD CARE SOLUTIONS

Child Care Resource and Referral educates and refers parents to a range of child care options; trains child care providers and provides education awards upon completion of college coursework, certificates and degrees; encourages community awareness of child care issues; collects data about child care needs and services; conveys information about local supply and demand.

QUALITY SUPPORT SERVICES

A team of child care specialist provides consultation on child care regulations and quality issues, and consults with employers concerned with child care problems in their workplace.

MORE AT FOUR

Statewide, state funded pre-kindergarten program that provides high-quality educational experiences for four-year-olds who are at risk of school failure. Program is community-based and voluntary. Administration, enrollment, monitoring and technical assistance is provided by the ICPYC.

EARLY LEARNING RESOURCE CENTER

Centers in Mooresville and Statesville have toys, books, and other resources that are available for members to check out and use in their homes, centers or classes. Membership is available to anyone who is a caregiver of a child under 5 years old or to early education college students. Each center has a large production area for making projects, laminating, and using recycled materials.

The Iredell County Rescue Squad is a volunteer agency that provides emergency care for the victims of automobile accidents, industrial accidents, and farm accidents in which the victim is trapped by the vehicle, a piece of industrial or farm machinery. The squad also provides ambulance stand-by service for volunteer fire departments at structure fires and for large gatherings such as football games or rodeos. Members respond to medical emergencies as First Responders to stabilize the sick or injured until the Emergency Medical Service arrives or as a back-up ambulance provider when the EMS is busy on calls. The squad will respond to assist surrounding counties in mutual aid requests for assistance. There is an organized Search and Rescue Team that conducts searches for those who become lost. The squad provides transportation of blood and human tissue for the local hospitals from the Red Cross in Charlotte, Winston-Salem, or Durham when blood supplies run low or if a surgery requires a special type.

SCAN PARENT AIDE PROGRAM

A home visitation program in which Parent Aides make home visits to families identified as at-risk for abuse or neglect. The matching of a family with a Parent Aide fosters change in behavior and reduces stress within the home, thus lessening the possibility of child abuse or neglect. The Parent Aide helps with problem solving, promotes the keeping of an environmentally safe home, encourages access to community services, and teaches the family how to have fun in a safe and nurturing way.

Eligibility: Iredell County families; no fees; DSS or self referrals

SCAN PARENTING CLASSES

Classes are designed to teach parents and caregivers new skills in disciplining children. Call 704-878-2227 for class times and locations and to sign up for a class. Childcare may be available if requested in advance.

SCAN PARENT SUPPORT GROUPS

VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The success of the SCAN program depends upon caring, committed volunteers to mentor families needing help being better parents. Parent Aide volunteers interview with SCAN staff and participate in a 12-hour training program. Call 704-878-2227 to become a volunteer.

Eligibility: Adults 18 years or older; must agree to a criminal background check

PUBLIC AWARENESS SERVICES

SCAN staff offers training and programs to civic organizations, healthcare and daycare providers, church groups, and other concerned groups on the awareness of child abuse and neglect and the cycle of abuse that exists in Iredell County.

ARK (AT RISK KIDS) PROGRAM

A home-based intervention program for adolescents who have come into contact with the juvenile court system. The overall goal of the program is to reduce delinquent behaviors, school suspensions, and training school commitments. The ARK program works with the parents of the teens to teach new parenting skills and with the juvenile to identify the causes of their negative behaviors and redirect the behaviors.

Eligibility: Iredell County families with children ages 10 - 17; referrals must be made by juvenile courts or through law enforcement (such as school resource officers); no fees

Social Security administers the following social insurance programs: retirement benefits, disability benefits, survivor benefits, Medicare hospital insurance and medical insurance benefits, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits.

RETIREMENT BENEFITS

A monthly check is payable as early as age 62. Full retirement benefits are at age 65 for people born before 1938. Beginning in year 2000, the age for full benefits will increase from 65 to 67 gradually. Reduced benefits at age 62 are about 80% of full retirement benefits. Early retirement benefits are reduced by 5/9 of 1% for each month received before full retirement age.

Eligibility: As early as age 62 (first month 62 the entire month), with no more than 10 years of covered work (40 quarters of coverage)

DISABILITY BENEFITS

A monthly check is payable to persons who have a physical or mental impairment that prevents them from doing substantial work for at least one year, or would likely result in their death. Generally, checks begin with 6th full month of disability.

Eligibility: Any worker who has worked at least 5 out of the last ten years of work before date of onset of disability and who is fully insured (there is special work requirement rules for people disabled before age 31); a disabled widow or widower as early as age 50, disabled children of retired, disabled, or insured deceased workers who are over age 18 and who become disabled before age 22.

BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN FAMILY MEMBERS

For each Social Security retirement and disability beneficiary, other family members might also be eligible for a monthly check.

Eligibility: Husband or wife age 62 or older; husband or wife any age caring for child under age 16 or disabled, children who are under age 18, or under 19 and attending high school full-time, or 18 or older who are severely disabled before age 22.

SURVIVORS BENEFITS

When a family breadwinner dies who had worked long enough or recently enough leaving certain dependents, those dependents may be eligible for a monthly survivor benefit check.

Eligibility: Widow or widower age 60 or older, widow or widower age 50 or older and disabled, widow or widower any age if caring for child under age 16 or disabled child, children as mentioned above under Family Benefits; parent(s) if they were being supported by 1/2 of their support, a special one-time death benefit of \$255 to surviving spouse or eligible child.

SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI)

SSI makes monthly payments to people who have low income and few assets.

Eligibility: Be U.S. citizen or legally in the U.S. and age 65 or older, or blind or disabled, payable to disabled children (as well as adults) if parents' income and assets are low

MEDICARE

Basic health insurance program for aged and disabled. Two parts of Medicare: 1. Hospital Insurance (Part A) helps pay inpatient hospital care and certain follow-up services; 2. Medical Insurance (Part B) helps pay doctors' services, outpatient hospital care, and other medical services.

Eligibility: Qualify automatically at age 65 for all Social Security beneficiaries, or after two year waiting period for disabled Social Security beneficiaries from month of first eligibility; people with permanent kidney failure requiring dialysis or transplant, certain government employees not eligible for Social Security benefits, also, people age 65 who are not eligible for any Social Security benefits who wish to pay a monthly premium for coverage.

HOW TO FILE

SSA encourages appointments for claims filing. Claims can be done by telephone, in office, or online at www.socialsecurity.gov.

Teen Health, Inc. strives to facilitate healthy lifestyles and to reduce at-risk behavior among adolescents in Iredell County. It promotes responsibility among young men and women and abstinence from high-risk behaviors.

SPECIALIZED WORKSHOPS AND SEMINARS

Teen Health, Inc. conducts a variety of workshops throughout the county for interested groups of adults and teens, including parent-child communication workshops, futures workshops, and strategic planning for life conferences. The agency will conduct workshops at no cost for interested groups. Teen Health also conducts specialized workshops for teens only (to address the specific needs of individual groups; eg. preparing for college; the dangers of marijuana; how to reduce stress). All workshops will be made accessible for those teens who are most at-risk.

RESEARCH AND PROGRAM EVALUATION

Teen Health conducts research on issues of adolescent health and preventive programs. The agency maintains an array of literature, videos, statistical data, and information about programs and projects. All resources are available to the public at no cost.

RESPONSIBLE ATTITUDES PROGRAM (RAP SESSIONS)

This program targets financially needy teens and their families in an attempt to reduce risk-taking behaviors, particularly unprotected sexual activity.

Eligibility: All participants must qualify financially for the program (families must be receiving public assistance or meet household income requirements). Participants must be enrolled in school and be neither parenting nor pregnant.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

Teen Health, Inc. implements four community awareness campaigns to raise awareness about issues affecting the well-being of adolescents: Male Responsibility Month (February); Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month (May); Impaired Decision-Making Month (July); and Let's Talk Month (October). The agency conducts workshops and public forums concerning each of these issues, disseminates educational materials throughout the community, and releases information through the local media. The agency also provides Teen Help Cards to adolescents at no cost.

LATINO OUTREACH PROGRAM

The general population of adolescents is already at-risk for negative and life-altering behaviors. By devoting resources to Latino teens through the Latino Outreach Program, we guarantee that all teens have equal access to preventive services. TEEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM

The Teen Entrepreneurship Program is designed to increase opportunities for economic self-sufficiency among youth from low-income families and to decrease risk-taking behavior among adolescents. This innovative program will teach practical business skills and entrepreneurship, enabling a targeted group of **tenth-graders** to create and develop their own businesses.
