Dogs not under direct control and/or at large; Sec. 3-8 (a)
Failure to properly dispose of a dead animal; Sec. 3-8 (f), (9) (g)
Failure to immunize a dog or cat against rabies; Sec. 3-9 (a), (2)
Public nuisance determination; Sec. 3-8 (d)

Level II
Failure to keep a female dog in a secure enclosure during estrus period; Sec. 3-8 (b)
Public nuisance animal at large after being deemed a public nuisance; Sec. 3-8 (d), (4)
Possession of an animal owned by another without permission of owner/caretaker; Sec. 3-8 (c)

Level III
Animal cruelty/cruel treatment and associated violations Section 3-8 (e), 1 - 11
Failure to comply with a dangerous dog order; Sec. 3-8 (f), (9) (e), (6) ii
Failure to comply with a potentially dangerous dog order; Sec. 3-8 (f), (9) (e), (1) – (5) & (6) i
Failure to maintain secure enclosure, direct control or restraint of a dog four (4) months of age or younger; Sec. 3-9 (a), (1)
Improper rabies tag or unauthorized removal of a rabies vaccination tag; Sec. 3-14
Interference with an animal control officer; Sec. 3-18

Level IV
Animal fighting and associated violations Section 3-8 (e), (12) – (20).
Failure to surrender a dog after being deemed potentially dangerous or dangerous; Sec. 3-8 (f), (9) (e), (6) i & ii
Failure to surrender an animal for quarantine or euthanization; Sec. 3-11
Killing, releasing, or removing an animal under observation or suspicion of rabies; Sec. 3-12
Possession of a wild or exotic animal; Sec. 3-8 (f), (9) (g)
Violation of area-wide emergency quarantine; Sec. 3-10
