

November 2, 2010 Election Schedule

- **ELECTION DAY**
 - **November 2, 2010** – General Election

- **VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINES**
 - **October 8, 2010** – Last day to register, change your party affiliation, or change your address for the General Election. (GS 163-82.6 (c)(1))

- **ONE-STOP VOTING** will be held at four (4) different locations:

- **POLLING PLACES**
 - **All polling places are open on Election Day from 6:30 am – 7:30 pm.**
 - To find your polling place go to www.sboe.state.nc.us. Click Voter Registration/Check your registration/Show me my voter information/enter your first name, last name, and date of birth and SUBMIT. This will bring up all your voter information. Scroll down the page to **MY POLLING LOCATION**. You will see your polling place as well as have access to a map of the location.

- **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**
 - **September 3, 2010** – Beginning date to request an absentee ballot for the General Election
 - **October 26, 2010** -- Last day to request an absentee ballot for the General election
 - **November 1, 2010** -- All voted absentee ballots must be returned to BOE by 5 pm.

Absentee ballots can be requested in person at the Board of Elections Office or by sending a written request to the Iredell County Board of Elections. Written requests must be received in the office no later than the Tuesday prior to Election Day. In order to be counted, the voted ballot must be received in the Board of Elections office by 5:00 pm on the day before the Election.

Absentee ballots may be requested by:

1. The voter
2. The voter's near relative (spouse, brother, sister, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, mother-in-law, father-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, stepparent, or stepchild).
3. The voter's verifiable legal guardian.

Note: No one with POWER OF ATTORNEY is allowed to sign for a voter unless she/he is the voter's near relative or the voter's verifiable legal guardian.

To request an absentee ballot by mail, send a handwritten note to the Board of Elections with the following information:

- Voter's full name
- Voter's residence in Iredell County
- Address the ballot should be mailed to
- Voter's Party affiliation (only for a primary election)
- Voter's date of birth
- Voter's daytime phone number
- Voter's signature (or signature of near relative or legal guardian and relationship to voter)
